THE BILETNIKOFF FOUNDATION



The mission of the Biletnikoff Foundation is to commemorate Tracey Biletnikoff's life and her untimely death and to enable young people to realize their full potential through the support of community and education programs that effectively address the related problems of substance abuse and domestic violence. In 2000, the Foundation launched Tracey's Place of Hope, a residential program for adolescent girls in crisis with mental health and substance abuse problems. The center helps turn tragedy into daily miracles by preparing young people

to manage their recovery, their mental and emotional health issues, as well as teaching teens the necessary skills to live independently. Most of our teens come to Tracey's Place of Hope with little or no vision for their future, but flourish when given the opportunity.

Through its partnership with St Judes Healing Center for Human Trafficked females starting from the age of ten to 24, the Biletnikoff Foundation has been able to expand the program and help even more teens turn their lives around from drug addiction, trafficking and violence. or more information, please visit www.biletnikoff.org.

THE BILETNIKOFF CENTER FOR HOPE



The Biletnikoff Center for Hope is a 2,000 square foot space that will be utilized by the girls living in Tracey's Place of Hope. This multi-functional space is made up of an office, filing and storage room, bathroom, kitchenette, walk-in closet and a large meeting space.

The center's primary use will be for group and one-on-one counseling sessions with the girls. These daily counseling sessions are currently being held in an open space in the home, which can be somewhat distracting due to the open floor plan and constant foot traffic. In addition, this large, multi-functional space will be used for a variety of activities such as group workout classes, bible study and holiday gatherings.

The walk-in closet will hold everything from blue jeans to prom dresses that the girls can utilize upon arrival to Tracey's Place. Often times, girls will arrive to the home with nothing but the clothes on their back. This walk-in closet will offer them a place to find anything that they may need to feel comfortable and have an easier adjustment, including a variety of clothing options.

The Biletnikoff Foundation looks forward to providing a private space where girls in the program can go to process every emotion in a secure, and most importantly, private setting. This is very much needed for their in-depth psychotherapy, AA and NA meetings. The Biletnikoff Foundation only works with the highest risk Teens in the State of California and the girls that arrive all deal with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD).



FRED BILETNIKOFF

Fred Biletnikoff, a 6-1, 190-pounder with excellent hands and deceptive speed, caught 589 passes for 8,974 yards and 76 touchdowns during his 14-year career with the Oakland Raiders from 1965 through 1978. At the time of his retirement, Fred not only dominated the Raiders' record book for pass receiving but he owned several significant NFL marks as well. Along with another Hall of Fame receiver, Raymond Berry, Fred held the record for having caught 40 or more passes in 10 consecutive seasons. His 70 receptions, 1,167 yards receiving and 10 touchdowns in 19 post-season games were also NFL post-season career records.

The talented pass-catcher came to the Raiders as their No. 2 draft pick in 1965. A 1964 All-America at Florida State, Biletnikoff caught four touchdown passes in his team's Gator Bowl victory over Oklahoma. He also played in the College All-Star game before reporting to the Raiders' training camp. Biletnikoff started as a special teams player and did not see action as a flanker until the seventh game of his rookie campaign. When he did get a chance to start, he responded with a seven-catch, 118-yard performance and, in the process, became a regular for good. A durable, dependable performer, Biletnikoff missed only eight games because of injury in 14 seasons.



Biletnikoff, a native of Erie, PA, reached the zenith of a career filled with outstanding achievements when he caught four passes for 79 yards to set up three Oakland scores in the Raiders' 32-14 victory in Super Bowl XI. He was named the game's Most Valuable Player. Fred was an All-AFL pick in that league's final 1969 season, earned All-Pro honors in 1972, and won All-AFC acclaim in 1970, 1972 and 1973. He played in two AFL All-Star games and four AFC-NFC Pro Bowl games as well as three AFL and five AFC championship games, plus Super Bowls II and XI.

Biletnikoff is the son of two Russian immigrants who came to America during the Russian Civil War. After his playing career, he coached for 17 years. Biletnikoff returned to the Raiders from 1989-1994 as a receiver's coach. In the late 1990s, he launched the Biletnikoff Foundation to help young people realize their full potential. Biletnikoff launched Tracey's Place of Hope, a residential program for adolescent girls in crisis, in 2000. Today, the best receiver in college football earns the Biletnikoff Award.
