Biletnikoff Foundation Mission



Biletnikoff Foundation's mission is to commemorate Tracey Biletnikoff's life and her untimely death and to enable young people to realize their full potential through the support of community and education programs that effectively address the related problems of substance abuse, domestic violence, and human trafficking.

In 2000, the Foundation launched Tracey's Place of Hope, supported by the Women's Recovery Association in Burlingame, CA, a residential program for adolescent girls in crisis with mental health, substance abuse, and human trafficking. The second Tracey's Place of Hope, supported by Koinonia Homes for Teens in Loomis, CA, was established in 2014 to manage recovery, mental, and emotional health

issues, and teach teens the necessary skills to live independently. The Biletnikoff Center of Hope, supported by Koinonia Homes for Teens in Loomis, CA, was established in 2023 as a counseling and activity center for teens. The Center helps turn tragedy into daily miracles.

The Foundation's current focus is building the Healing Center supported by St. Judes Ranch for Children, the first of its kind. A new 10-acre campus with specialized residential services to help child victims of sex trafficking, ages 10-18, with a holistic array of services, including an on-site school, yoga, gardening, art therapy, psychotherapy, and other services to support a young person transitioning from victim to survivor to a thriving young person. All services will be trauma-informed.



The Biletnikoff Foundation has been able to expand the program and help even more teens turn their lives around from drug addiction, trafficking, and violence. Most of our teens come to Tracey's Place of Hope with little or no vision for their future but flourish when given the opportunity.



Fred Biletnikoff



Fred Biletnikoff, a 6-1, 190-pounder with excellent hands and deceptive speed, caught 589 passes for 8,974 yards and 76 touchdowns during his 14-year career with the Oakland Raiders from 1965 through 1978. At the time of his retirement, Fred dominated the Raiders' record book for pass receiving and owned several significant NFL records. Along with another Hall of Fame receiver, Raymond Berry, Fred held the record for having caught 40 or more passes in 10 consecutive seasons. His 70 receptions, 1,167 yards receiving, and 10 touchdowns in 19 post-season games were NFL post-season career records.

The Raiders' number two pick in the 1965 draft, Biletnikoff was a star at Florida State and caught four touchdown passes in the Gator Bowl victory over

Oklahoma in 1964. He played in the College All-Star game before reporting to the Raiders' training camp and began as a special teams player before becoming a regular flanker after the seventh game of his rookie season. During his first start, Biletnikoff made 7 catches for 118-yards, securing a permanent starting position. A was a durable player, only missing 8 games due to injury in 14 seasons.

Biletnikoff, a native of Erie, Pennsylvania, was awarded the game's Most Valuable Player after catching four passes for 79 yards to set up three Oakland scores in the Raiders' 32-14 victory in Super Bowl XI. Fred was named an All-AFL pick in that league's final 1969 season, earned All-Pro honors in 1972, and won All-AFC acclaim in 1970, 1972, and 1973. He played in two AFL All-Star games and was selected for six AFC-NFC Pro Bowl games, as well as three AFL and five AFC championship games, plus Super Bowls II and XI. Today, the Biletnikoff Award is given to the best receiver in college football.

Biletnikoff is the son of two Russian immigrants who came to America during the Russian Civil War. After his playing career, he returned to the Raiders from 1989-2007 as a receiver's coach. Fred and Angela were married in 1991 and have a daughter named Dacia. They started the Biletnikoff Foundation in 2000 to help young people realize their full potential. Biletnikoff's launched Tracey's Place of Hope, a residential program for adolescent girls in crisis, in 2000.
